What is THP-Plus?

- THP-Plus is a program for former foster and probation youth that provides **safe, affordable housing** and comprehensive **supportive services**.
- THP-Plus allows youth to have the greatest amount of **freedom** possible to prepare them for **self-sufficiency**.



Principles of THP-Plus

- Age appropriate
- Distinct from foster care
- Greatest amount of freedom possible
- Strong emphasis on supportive services



Host Family in THP-Plus

- Participant lives with caring permanent connection
- Participant receives comprehensive supportive services
- Adult receives a monthly THP-Plus subsidy for 24 months
- Adult is screened and certified by THP-Plus service provider



Principles & Rationale

- Supports permanency, a permanent lifelong connection with a caring adult
- Consistent with experience of youth from intact families
- Youth live in family setting





County-Administered Program

Stanislaus County, California



Identifying host families & youth participants

- Youth applies for host family program and identifies lifelong connection
- Lifelong connection applies to be host family

County-administered program



Screening potential host families

- Stanislaus County:
 - Reviews host family application & interviews family to gauge level of commitment to youth
 - Conducts home inspection
 - Completes background checks
 - Certifies host families

County-administered program



Training host families and youth participants

- Youth and adult meet with aftercare social worker to establish expectations
- Youth and adult complete Connected for Life and Shared Housing Agreements
- Youth and adult create a budget sheet outlining use of funds

County-administered program





Shared Housing Agreement Essential Elements

- Privacy
- Household cleanliness
- Visitors & overnight guests
- House rules (television, pets, household curfew)

Rental Subsidy

Program Month	THP-Plus Participant Contribution
Months 1-6	No contribution
Months 7-12	\$100/month
Months 13-18	\$200/month
Months 19-20	\$300/month
Months 21-23	\$400/month
Month 24	\$500

County-administered program

Lessons Learned

- Youth participant needs as much or more case management and support as the program progresses
- Host family needs continued support to maintain a healthy relationship with the youth participant
- High quality case management and sufficient staffing are essential for program success
- Youth participants continue to seek out case management after exiting the program

Screening potential host families

First Place for Youth:

- Performs initial assessment with potential host family
- Completes second assessment & physical inspection at home of prospective host family
- Conducts background checks of household
- Certifies host family

Non-profit provider administered program



Training host families and youth participants

- Youth connects with case manager
- Youth participates in economic literacy
- Host family participates in Foster Care 101
- Youth and adult complete training & connect with case manager
- First Place organizes a series of house meetings with case manager, host family, and youth participant

- FY 07-08 Budget (proposed): \$15.5 million
- Planning allocation: May
